1.0 CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order by Chair Douglas at 7:00 P.M. There was not a quorum present.

4.0 APPROVE MINUTES OF THE DECEMBER 12, 2007 MEETING

5.0 COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS/PUBLIC COMMENT

Commissioner Martin reported that she recently attended a Board of Supervisors meeting in which Steve D’Gati, a retired probation officer, was honored. She commented that Mr. D’Gati would make an excellent JJDPC commissioner.

6.0 COMMUNITY RELATIONS REPORTS

6.1 DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES

Cindy Sutcliffe reported that a group of CWS staff will be going to Sacramento for a training session on the California Connected By 25 program

6.2 NATIVE AMERICAN CONCERNS

Commissioner Feliz reported that he is trying to organize a Native American Concerns Committee meeting for January 14. He will attempt to encourage individuals from the Tribal Roundtable and Two Feathers to participate.

6.3 CFS/MENTAL HEALTH

Bill Nichols reported that the department has hired a Regional Facility clinician to replace the one who recently resigned. Bill also reported that they have begun the process of hiring a Clinical Supervisor who will be assigned to the Regional Facility.

6.4 REGIONAL FACILITY

Commissioner Martin reported that the first group of youth who went through the new communication skills training at the Regional Facility have all completed it successfully. According to feedback she has received from various RF staff and the youth themselves, this training has been quite helpful and will ease the transition into the ART program.

7.0 BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

Jimmy Smith reported that he is extremely concerned about the possibility of severe budget cuts and how they will impact services in Humboldt County. He is anxiously awaiting the release of the Governor’s budget proposal. He also noted that the public awareness campaign on methamphetamine is continuing on schedule though he did not report any specific details.
