1.0 CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order by Chair Daniel at 7:00 P.M. A quorum was present.

1.1 PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

There was not a flag in the room.

1.2 INTRODUCTIONS

Members and guests introduced themselves.

2.0 ADJUSTMENTS TO THE AGENDA

None.

3.0 CORRESPONDENCE

Chair Daniel read a letter given to him by Doug Rasines which was an advertisement for the Total Transformation Program.

4.0 APPROVE MINUTES OF THE OCTOBER 11, 2006 MEETING

It was moved by Commissioner Meisel and seconded by Commissioner Hobbs to approve the minutes with the addition of the Delinquency Prevention report. Motion carried.

5.0 COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS/PUBLIC COMMENT

Members of the public expressed several concerns regarding the recent police shooting in Eureka. Some of the concerns raised by members of the public included the concern that there would not be an adequate investigation of the incident conducted by the police department, a concern that any investigations that did take place would be biased in favor of the police, and a concern that this incident would encourage a “shoot first ask questions later” mentality among police officers. Some members of the public also were concerned about the way the incident has been portrayed in the media. A considerable amount of discussion followed.

6.0 REPORTS

6.1 PROBATION

Doug Rasines reported on his follow-up work on some of the concerns that had been raised at the October JJDPC meeting about Juvenile Hall and the Regional Facility. One concern had to do with certain youth having difficulty receiving their prescribed medications while in Juvenile Hall. Doug reported that they have developed a handout which is available to parents and other visitors which explains the procedures for such things as mail, phone calls, recreation, and medication procedures. Doug also said that JH staff have recently been trained on working with Mental Health to coordinate medication treatment. Regarding the concern about insufficient recreation time, Doug noted that there will now be more careful auditing of the log books to make sure all youth at JH receive recreation time according to policy. Finally, Doug addressed the concern about military recruiters at the Regional Facility. He had learned that the No Child Left Behind law requires that all schools allow military recruiters on campus. However, the youth are not required to attend recruiting sessions and may opt out at any time without penalty.

6.2 HUMBOLDT COUNTY OFFICE OF EDUCATION

Kim Cobine provided brochures on the upcoming Challenge Days. The ones at Eureka High took place November 10-12, 2006. They will be coming to Fortuna High in march of 2007 but no specific date was given.

7.0 ADJOURNMENT

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 9:30 P.M.
